- Report from the Executive Committee meeting: Michael Casdorph From IT, came to help working with logistics, technology, rooms, video taping meetings, using Echo 360. 2) AU institute research BOD came, sent nominations to serve for three years. 3) Discussed nominations for Vice chair and at-large senators, the survey will be open until April 27th, we need 20% participation. 4) Academic---Strategic planning, John Tennos educational advisement board—best practice for strategic planning, chairs, deans, on up took part in the discussion.
- Report from USGFC meeting on March 31, 2017: met with chancellor who discussed legislative session to be discussed later, and how we are enacting changes in legislation USSG: ad hoc committees to address issues faculty to administration ratios, review of faculty after evaluations, and others, in hopes that they will be addressed in the fall. AUUP had a presence at conference, discussions include the process of Presidents residing at senate meetings, how this works.

Encourage participation, the response is low, focus teams will address issues and consider changes May 8th so input is necessary. Summer 2017 a group will formulate a formal draft and shared in the fall.

- O Review of the year & what lies ahead: 4th year in row Student Rec increased use by 10%, over 110,000 visits, we can track –Student health over 9,000 visit, housing is up 190 students compared to last year and are ahead next year compared to this year, expect it to be full again. Health campus, changed an area into a green area for extramural activities, have 9 more sports campuses, and expect 18 sports clubs total next year. We are finding that the more involved in rec center the more likely you are to have higher grades. Changes in both student centers, trying to improve technology in both, beginning with the JSAC, Increased number of students receiving scholarships and scholarship dollars, we do not offer enough which hurts our ability to be competitive, developing more partnership with military, and increasing dual enrollment, more students using counseling services and CARE reports
- o Food pantries on both campuses, work to promote those,
- o Indicators for increase enrollment are positive: Applications and acceptance, deposits are up, housing numbers are up, orientation numbers are up, transfers are slightly up,
- SGA has selected new leadership for next year
- Penny question University Village—upkeep may not be sufficient, need to make sure students need information and know how to file complaints, we regularly update, will be having this discussion
- Other question: food service—improving menus improving volume, our contract is tied through the hospital, negotiating is difficult we do not have the users necessary to make such negotiating possible but doing what we can.
