Georgia Board of Healthcare Workforce Loan Repayment Programs Summary

The Georgia Board of Healthcare Workforce offers loan repayment programs for various healthcare professionals, including physicians, dentists, nurse practitioners (NPs), and physician assistants (PAs). These programs aim to incentivize healthcare providers to work in underserved areas of the state. Here is a summary of the loan repayment programs for each profession:

- 1. Physician Loan Repayment Programs:
- Physician for Rural Areas: (PRAA): Designed for physicians practicing in counties with populations
 of less than 50,000, this program offers up to \$100,000 in loan repayment over four years but

- Physician Assistant Loan Repayment Program (PALRP): PAs who work in counties with populations of less than 50,000 are eligible for up to \$40,000 in loan repayment over four years in loan repayment but must reapply annually. The program seeks to address the shortage of PAs in underserved areas and improve access to care.

Each loan repayment program requires participants to commit to a specific period of service in designated underserved areas. The application process involves submitting necessary documentation such as proof of educational debt, employment verification, and license verification.

These loan repayment programs offered by the Georgia Board of Healthcare Workforce play a crucial role in attracting and retaining healthcare professionals in underserved areas, addressing healthcare disparities, and improving access to care for Georgia residents across various healthcare disciplines.
